God’s Instructions: Matthew 19:16-30; Luke 19:8-10; Genesis 12:1-2; John 3:16-17; 1 Timothy 6:17-19

2. What thoughts or feelings come to mind when you read that some people “feel lonely and discriminated against because of their prosperity”? Be honest! Have you ever felt that way?

3. Have you ever found yourself or someone you know showing signs that they are living in a ‘slum of wealth’? What were the signs?

4. Are there any local church jobs that affluent members are better qualified to fill than the less affluent members of the congregation?

5. Do you ever find yourself ‘coming to Jesus by night’ so that your friends and peers don’t know about it?

6. What baggage is God convicting you to remove so that you can fit through the ‘eye of a needle’ into heaven?
